

### **CHOICES FOR KIDS DURING WORSHIP**

- 1. RE (Religious Exploration) programs are over for the "church year" and will start up again in the Fall.
- 2. Kids are very welcome in Worship! They can sit with their adults (floor is always fine) OR hang in the Kid Area with table and chairs, cushions, books, fidget toys, stuffies, Bristle Blocks, coloring pages, drawing supplies, and more.
- Kids can HELP on Sundays! Talk to a Greeter or Usher. Things kids often do: Greeter - outside or in foyer (greet people as they come in, especially kids), Usher - handing out Orders of Service by Sanctuary door, Ring the bell start of Worship, Usher - passing the Offering baskets in the middle of worship...
- 4. **Nursery is open but UNSTAFFED**. Children must be supervised at all times. Feel free to borrow quiet toys for worship and return them after. Changing table and sink.

### RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH NEXT YEAR

We are planning to run OWL: Sexuality Education for Grades 7-8. We hope to start up High **School Youth Group** again. We do our best to base our offerings, especially for the younger children, on our actual CVUUS kids each year. We continue to be limited by a lack of volunteers and are considering how best to deal with that reality. RE 24-25 information will come out at the end of the Summer.


